How to apply

Applications go through **UCAS** (the University & Colleges Admissions Service). They will ask for: academic qualifications and grades; work experience; personal statement on why you want to study your subject.

You can apply to a maximum of 5 different courses & institutions, so it's important to research where and what you want to study!

Finance
